P2P is an important tool for transferring ITS knowledge, resources, and experiences among public agencies and throughout the transportation industry. The P2P Program tries to cover all costs associated with the assistance efforts, within the limits of the [program's guidelines](#) and the availability of funding. A broad range of organizations are eligible for P2P assistance including State, county, and city transportation and public works offices, Transit agencies, Turnpike and tollway authorities, Metropolitan and Statewide planning organizations, and more.
